

SURVIVING AMERICAN SEACOAST ARTILLERY WEAPONS

Compiled: Lists in *CDSG News/Journal* prepared by C.L. Kimbell (1985), R.D. Zink (1989), and T.C. McGovern (1992 and 1996).

General Note: This is an attempt to list surviving weapons (or the same model/type) that were used by the American armed forces, either in the U.S. and overseas, in a coast defense role in the “modern era” (1890 to 1950). Items to be included in this list must retain at least the whole gun/mortar/howitzer. Surviving weapons from earlier periods, muzzleloading cannon (rifled and smoothbore), field artillery (except for 155mm), mobile anti-aircraft guns, and British, Canadian, or Mexican coast artillery are excluded from this list, even if used in North America (see other list). In a few cases, weapons have been included because they represent weapons similar to those used for coast defense, and are sufficiently interesting to warrant inclusion. Every effort has been made to make this list as accurate as possible, but it will probably contain a number of errors and omissions. The list is arranged by caliber (largest to smallest). The *first line* contains data about the weapon: the quantity at the site, the caliber of weapon (inches or millimeters), the model, serial number, and place of manufacture, if known. This information is repeated for the carriage. The *last line* contains data about the location of the weapon: battery or site where the weapon is currently located, fort or installation, geographic location, and city and/or country.

General Note: This is an attempt to list surviving weapons (or the same model/type) that were used by British, Canadian, or Mexican armed forces, only in North America, in a coast defense role in the "modern era" (1890 to 1950). Items to be included in this list must retain at least the whole gun/mortar/howitzer. Surviving weapons from earlier periods, muzzleloading cannon (rifled and smoothbore), field artillery (except for 155mm), mobile anti-aircraft guns, and coast artillery manned by American armed forces (see other list) are excluded from this list, even if used in North America. In a few cases, weapons have been included because they represent weapons similar to those used for coast defense, and are sufficiently interesting to warrant inclusion. Every effort has been made to make this list as accurate as possible, but it will probably contain a number of errors and omissions. The list is arranged by caliber (largest to smallest). The *first line* contains data about the weapon: the quantity at the site, the caliber of weapon (inches or millimeters), the model, serial number, and place of manufacture, if known. This information is repeated for the carriage. The *last line* contains data about the location of the weapon: battery or site where the weapon is currently located, fort or installation, geographic location, and city and/or country.
